

KOREA CROWNED CHAMPIONS AT ITF ASIA 14&U DEVELOPMENT CHAMPIONSHIPS FINALS.

Team Korea wrapped up a solid two-week campaign by lifting the overall Champions title at the ITF Asia 14&U Development Championship Finals, held at the DLTA Tennis Complex in New Delhi from April 22 to May 3, 2025. Korean players made their presence felt in both singles and doubles, with Siyun Kim, Junseo Jang, Yerin Lim, and Seohyeon Kim picking up key wins across the event.

India's Jensi Dipakbhai Kanabar also had a tournament to remember. She bagged the girls' singles title in both weeks.

A total of 14 nations and 2 ITF regional teams (West & Central Asia and South, Southeast & East Asia) competed this year. The tournament featured 64 players—32 boys and 32 girls—fighting it out on hard courts.



In Week 1, Siyun Kim and Jensi Dipakbhai Kanabar ruled the courts. Siyun Kim fought hard to beat Hong Kong's Fu Wang Choi in a three-set thriller, 2-6, 6-2, 6-4, winning the boys' title.

In the third-place match, China's Yuting Wu edged out Korea's Junseo Jang in a nail-biting finish, 5-7, 7-6(9), [10-7].

Kim then teamed up with Junseo Jang to take the boys' doubles title, overcoming Chinese Taipei's Tsai Bin-Huan and Tseng Yen-Chia with a solid 6-2, 4-2 (retired).



On the girls' side, Jensi Dipakbhai Kanabar delivered a commanding display to beat Korea's Yerin Lim, 6-1, 6-2.

Shrishti Kiran from India also fought back, to defeat China's Jiarui Sun, 2-6, 6-4, [10-5], earning third place.

Chinese Taipei's Tsai-Jun Chiang and Ke-Chieh Hsu claimed the doubles crown, beating China's Jiarui Sun and Jiayi Lu 6-2, 7-5.





In the second week, Junseo Jang from Korea dominated the Boys' singles final, defeating Siyun Kim, 6-2, 7-5, in an all-Korean showdown.

China's Yuting Wu finished third, defeating Fu Wang Choi in straight sets, 6-4, 6-3.

In boys doubles, Junseo Jang and Siyun Kim teamed up to secure their second doubles title, beating Indonesia's Purustama Komang Bagus and Ethan Jake Frans, 6-2, 4-6, [10-3].

Jensi Dipakbhai kept her winning streak alive by claiming her second straight singles crown, overcoming Chiang Tsai-Jung of Chinese Taipei, 1-6, 6-4, 6-3, securing her second singles title in a row.

Nepal's Shivali Gurung took third place after a 6-1, 6-4 win over China's Jiarui Sun.

In the girls' doubles final, Korea's Yerin Lim and Seohyeon Kim were unstoppable, crushing Taipei's Hsu Ki-Chieh and Tsai-Jung, 6-2, 6-0.

The tournament also serves as a gateway to bigger events. Siyun Kim (KOR) and Yuting Wu (CHN) in the boys' category, and Jensi Dipakbhai Kanabar (IND) and Yerin Lim (KOR) in the girls' category have qualified for the Wimbledon (14&U Championships). Meanwhile, Siyun Kim (KOR), Junseo Jang (KOR) in boys and Jensi Dipakbhai Kanabar (IND), and Jiarui Sun (CHN) in girls will be selected for the GSPDP/ITF/ATF team that will tour Europe later this year.
